It is an important administration function keeping track of our students, and you can help assure us that our students are safe each day by promptly advising the school of any absences.



Our themes



Science—Our focus in science this term is living and non-living things, and the conditions necessary for the growth of plants.

HASS—Our focus in HASS this term has been on family.

English—In English, the students have engaged in reading comprehensions and are writing informational reports on a topic of their interest.

Mathematics—The students have begun learning addition and subtraction of numbers, fractions and time.

Our weekly goals system encourages students to write goals that they want to work towards. Each week a student is nominated as the '**student of the week**', and their reward is a prize from the prize box. Students also earn points during each period of the day including recess and lunch for meeting behavioural and school work expectations; they can redeem their points for free time (daily).

The students enjoy going to the library once a week (on Fridays) to read, borrow books and be in the presence of a wider community of learners. This is an opportunity they treasure dearly and look forward to every week.

We are delighted that the students have settled in well and that as a class, we are all developing positive, supportive relationships with each other.


Our themes

Science—In science this term we are looking at heat energy. The students have conducted a number of experiments involving heat transference and heat sources.

HASS — In HASS we have been looking at celebrations around the world, as well as thinking of important aspects of a celebration that we could organise later in the year.

English— Our focus this term is on building narratives. We are starting by looking at a novel study of *Wonder* by R. J. Palacio; focusing on its theme of kindness. The students will then write their own imaginative texts .

Mathematics—So far in maths we have explored place value, for some students even up to 10,000! We will be moving into money and financial matters in the second half of the term.



Our reward time system is an effective way in which we celebrate student achievement and positive student behaviour, whilst simultaneously promoting kindness to one another. In our classroom, the students nominate other students for reward time who they feel have followed the classrooms rules; all students are working hard to earn their reward time.


All students are working hard to achieve their personal goals for the term. The students are also following the 'You Can Do It' program
